This past month we finally got to finish our wall mural on the school facade at the rubber factory! Ben and I worked together to paint the base and then we made it a large team effort to stamp all of the students and teachers hands to truly make it one piece that represents the whole. It was so fun!

The rubber factory is the class that Eric teaches English for an hour Tue-Thur. Ben has been joining Aiden Ohler there every Monday to do a gym class with the kids. During Eric's English time there Jordyn and a number of the other girls from our body, around her age, go to help with the younger ESL students while Eric teaches the older ones after they separate after song time. Our brothers Chai and Steven teach the kids in Myanmar Mon-Thu in the afternoons.

There have been even more visitations happening where a group will meet with families in the farms. This is such a blessing to be invited into

homes and able to build rapport and be able to share the good news!

Recently, I was invited to co-lead a 2-day English camp at a local Technical College with my friend. It was quite the task with 250 students the first day and around 170 the second day, with only her and I as the English speakers... but it too was a fun and blessed time.

We were able to have a big gathering at the "White House" with our brother and sister in Christ (Travis and Tiff). This is their ministry house they use to aid in the opening of doors within the community they live in and reaching the large number of college students nearby. There were games, food and a good time of gathering together both as a body of believers as well as inviting others to join in and see what it is like. We pray for their ministry here in U:၇ and that God will grow and increase their number as a gathering here and open many doors for them to share the gospel.

They have been without power and water here for over a month since it has happened. Our friends in Myanmar are experiencing the same thing with entire villages being destroyed and washed away.

We now leave in just under 2 weeks and it seems all together crazy how quickly this time has gone by.
